




Figure 1. Typical Forward Voltage

Figure 4. Maximum Reverse Current






Figure 5. Current Derating

Figure 6. Forward Power Dissipation




Figure 7. Capacitance

\* Reverse power dissipation and the possibility of thermal runaway must be considered when operating this device under any reverse voltage conditions. 



Figure 9. Thermal Response


